### BACKGROUND

Distance learning and digital tools don't just belong to emergency training situations. On the contrary, face-to face and distance learning activities, often facilitated by technology, can constitute a very effective blend for learning. However, even if we know ICT can boost learners' engagement, we don't often know how technology can help us to become more effective educators. Challenges lie in bringing all stakeholders together, ensure appropriate instructional support, support equity and inclusion.

In addition to this, the modalities definitions are a moving target, as the distinctions among them are increasingly blurred: *face-to-face, on-site, in-person, blended, hybrid, hyflex, online, remote, distance* and more. As educational technology evolves to meet the learners' needs in a hybrid world, the very concepts of **training location** and **mode** are expanding. The wide range of modalities available to educators today could be a powerful tool. With a **cross-modality approach**, it's possible to design learning environments that engage learners in multiple ways, speak to the needs of diverse groups of learners, align with a range of instructional goals, and remove geographic boundaries between learners and experts.

Recognizing the **significance of active learning** and the **evolution of how people learn nowadays**, the <u>European Trade Union Institute (ETUI)</u> and the <u>International Training</u> <u>Centre of the International Labour Organization (ITCILO)</u> have been actively organizing pedagogical workshops on active learning methodologies on a yearly basis for **Trade Union Trainers** and **Eurotrainers** employing a range of modalities, including face-to-face, online, and blended learning.

This training has been conceived to meet the challenge posed by hybrid and blended learning. Over the course of 5 weeks, learners will be guided in the development of blended and hybrid learning practices and strategies. By providing them with the necessary tools and techniques to implement active learning in blended or hybrid settings, these initiatives contribute to the continuous improvement of educational practices, ultimately benefiting learners and promoting effective knowledge consolidation.

### WHAT TOPICS DOES THE COURSE COVER?

This course is designed to help understand the benefits of blended and hybrid learning. As a participant, you will find out how to use technology more effectively to support learners both in blended and hybrid environments, and understand how to better embed it in your learning strategies. - Definitions of blended and hybrid learning
- Models that underpin blended and hybrid learning
- Digital technologies available to support blended and hybrid learning and the role of digital technology in making training and learning more flexible
- Collaboration in blended and hybrid learning

### WHAT IS THE COURSE METHODOLOGY?

The training adopts itself a **blended and hybrid approach** by embedding the following dimensions:

### 1. Project-Based Learning

By having a project-based approach, learners are promoted to think critically and solve complex problems.

#### 2. Flipped Classroom Blended Learning

The most widely known type of blended learning is Flipped Classroom. This training method focuses more on online learning rather than face-to-face learning, giving learners the freedom to approach tasks at their own pace. The learning materials are created, analysed and provided to remote learners to help them prepare for inclass active learning activities. This method allows learners to develop new skills such as time-management and critical thinking, whilst also encouraging a personalised approach to knowledge.

#### 3. In Outside-In Blended Learning

Learning starts outside the physical classroom, creating opportunities for learners to gain experiences online or within other learning spaces to then bring back to the classroom.

- Develop a deeper understanding of blended and hybrid learning, and how to use it in their own teaching practices
- Get inspired by analyzing examples of different blends
- Get exposed to diverse ICT tools, apps, and/or platforms that can be useful
- Use new tools for learner-centred training approaches and competency-based education
- Design blended and hybrid learning activities
